

## COMMONWEALTH DIGEST

[*Editors' Note* : This first issue of the Commonwealth Digest is intended to provide lawyers with a key to those proceedings in the Commonwealth Parliament in which they are most likely to be interested. It is, of course, selective. The Digest is in the nature of an experiment, and the Editors would welcome comment upon it. It does not attempt to duplicate the excellent service of the 'Review of Legislation : Commonwealth' in the *University of Western Australia Law Review*, and the two series should be regarded as complementary.

The Editors hope that the scope of the Digest might in due course be extended—for example, to note the appearance of official Commonwealth Government publications of particular interest to lawyers. That is why the series is named 'Commonwealth Digest' and not 'Commonwealth Parliamentary Digest', although in this first issue it is indeed no more than that.]

This digest covers the period 26 March 1963 to 30 October 1963, and is compiled from the published debates of the Parliament of the Commonwealth of Australia.

The page references to Parliamentary Debates ('S. Deb.' and 'H.R. Deb.') are to the published debates of the Senate and the House of Representatives, for the first Session of the Twenty-fourth Parliament, third and fourth periods.

### **Citizenship**

On 30 October, the Minister for Immigration supplied answers to questions upon notice outlining which countries regard Australian naturalization as conferring dual nationality, which countries regard return to the homeland after Australian naturalization as a reversion to the former nationality and which countries hold emigrants liable for military service. S. Deb. 1577.

### **Capital Punishment**

On 24 September, the Attorney-General, in answer to a question upon notice, announced that of the five death sentences passed under territorial laws since 1950, only two had been carried into execution.<sup>1</sup> No death sentences have been passed under Commonwealth Acts in that period. H.R. Deb. 1325-1326.

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<sup>1</sup> On 11 March 1964, the Supreme Court of the Australian Capital Territory passed sentence of death on two youths convicted of rape. The death penalty is mandatory under A.C.T. law in such cases. These sentences have since been commuted to terms of imprisonment.

**Civil Liberties**

On 21 May, the Prime Minister stated that no inhibitions were placed on members of the Public Service in the exercise of their civil rights—such as political partisanship. H.R. Deb. 1561.

On 10 September, the Prime Minister stated in answer to a question upon notice that the government had no intention of appointing an ombudsman to hear complaints about administrative action. H.R. Deb. 807.

**Company Law**

On 7 May, the Treasurer stated that consideration was being given to allowing accounting periods to be altered so as not to terminate on 30 June where this was inconvenient. H.R. Deb. 1040.

**Conciliation and Arbitration**

On 21 May, the Minister representing the Minister for Labour and National Service said he would consider it strange for the government to attempt to upset the decision of the Commonwealth Industrial Court by the remission of fines imposed by that Court. S. Deb. 556.

**Copyright**

On 9 April, the acting Minister for External Affairs listed, in answer to a question upon notice, the countries that had ratified the 1948 International Convention for the Protection of Literary, Scientific and Artistic Works, the 1952 Universal Copyright Convention and the 1961 International Convention for the Protection of Performers, Producers of Phonograms and Broadcasting Organizations. H.R. Deb. 540.

**Education**

On 21 May, the Minister representing the Minister for Labour and National Service pointed out that financial aid from the Commonwealth to the Royal Melbourne Institute of Technology which was entirely under the control of the Victorian Government would be contrary to the Commonwealth-State financial arrangements. S. Deb. 558.

**Electoral Matters**

On 9 April, the Postmaster-General supplied answers to questions upon notice regarding the enforcement of provisions of the Commonwealth Electoral Act 1918-1962 dealing with pre-election broadcasting. S. Deb. 18-19.

On 23 October, the Minister for the Interior, in answer to questions, stated that a forthcoming amendment of the Representation Act 1905-1938 was intended to provide that any fraction of a quota would entitle a State to have a member. He added that a Bill would not be introduced in that session. H.R. Deb. 2120, 2124.

**Health**

On 23 May, the Minister for Health supplied answers to questions upon notice explaining the matters dealt with by the Medical Services Committees of Inquiry appointed in each State under the National Health Act 1953-1962. H.R. Deb. 1826.

On 23 May, the Minister for Health supplied answers to questions upon notice concerning payments under the Pensioner Medical Service, both as to eligibility for payments and as to actual cost to the Government. H. R. Deb. 1827.

**International Affairs**

On 4 April, the Minister for Trade delivered a Ministerial Statement dealing with the International Coffee Agreement. H.R. Deb. 431-434.

On 9 May, the Minister for External Affairs laid before the House the agreement between Australia and the United States of America (signed 9 May 1963) concerning the status of United States Forces in Australia.

On 21 May, the Minister representing the Minister for External Affairs said that despite Indonesia's increased expenditure on armaments, Australia would continue to supply economic aid to that country. S. Deb. 554.

On 15 August, the Minister for External Affairs made a Ministerial Statement concerning the Treaty Banning Nuclear Weapon Tests in the Atmosphere, in Outer Space and under Water. H.R. Deb. 194-199.

On 17 September, in reply to a question, and on 25 September in a Ministerial Statement, the Prime Minister outlined Australia's obligations with respect to the defence of Malaysia. H. R. Deb. 1026, 1338.

On 18 September, the Minister for External Affairs, in reply to a question upon notice, listed the treaties that have been drafted or reviewed at conferences attended by Australian representatives or observers since 22 August 1962. H.R. Deb. 1163.

On 22 October, the Minister for External Affairs stated that the Government of Indonesia had given an assurance that proper steps would be taken to safeguard the safety of Australian aircraft flying over Indonesian territory. H.R. Deb. 2031.

On 22 October, the Minister for Air said there were no Australian air patrols of the New Guinea-West Irian border. H.R. Deb. 2031.

**International Court of Justice**

On 18 April, the Minister for External Affairs stated, in answer to questions upon notice, the dates and conditions on which Australia accepted the jurisdiction of the Permanent Court of International Justice and of the International Court of Justice. H.R. Deb. 696.

**Parliamentary Privilege**

On 9 April, the Prime Minister stated, in answer to a question upon notice, that although in 1955<sup>2</sup> he had undertaken to reconsider the whole

question of parliamentary privileges, he did not contemplate any immediate action to raise the question in the Parliament. H.R. Deb. 541.

On 9 May, the Speaker of the House of Representatives stated that there was nothing irregular in Hansard reporters giving evidence in a libel action before the Supreme Court of the Australian Capital Territory when the House had given its approval of such action. H.R. Deb. 1189-1190.

### **Restrictive Trade Practices**

On 25 September, the Leader of the Government in the Senate said that when the Government had decided on the exact form of the proposed restrictive trade practices legislation, there would be discussions between the Commonwealth Attorney-General and the State Attorneys-General on the legal issues involved. S. Deb. 789.

On 26 September, the Minister for Trade outlined the policy of the Government on franchises, agreements, and other restrictive practices entered into by Australian companies and their overseas principals or companies from which they have patents which restrict exports from Australia by these Australian companies. H.R. Deb. 1408.

### **Social Services**

#### *Repatriation*

On 22 May, the Minister for Repatriation, in answer to questions upon notice, explained the system of appeals from a determination of the Repatriation Board. H.R. Deb. 1736.

#### *Supplementary Payments*

On 4 April, the Minister for Social Services stated, in answer to questions upon notice, which recipients of Commonwealth Social Services payments were eligible for payment of the supplementary allowance. H.R. Deb. 467.

#### *Unemployment Benefits*

On 22 May, the Minister for Labour and National Service stated, in answer to questions upon notice, the conditions under which benefits were awarded. H.R. Deb. 1731.

### **Taxation**

On 10 April, the Treasurer said that work was proceeding on the drafting of income tax legislation following proposals made in the report of the Ligertwood committee on taxation.<sup>3</sup> He was unable to say when this legislation would be ready. He added, however, that the report would have to be dealt with in parts and not as a whole. H.R. Deb. 552.

On 22 May, the Treasurer supplied answers to questions upon notice in which he said that the Commonwealth Committee on Taxation had acted on the suggestion of Fullagar J. in *Stuckey v. Iliff*,<sup>4</sup> and had recommended a revision of Part VII of the Income Tax and Social Services Contribution Assessment Act and in particular of section 247. S. Deb. 617.

### **Territories of the Commonwealth**

#### *Northern Territory*

On 9 April, the Minister for Territories supplied answers to questions upon notice stating that, contrary to the view expressed in the Fifteenth Report of the Regulations and Ordinances Committee, tabled in the Senate on 22 September 1959, the Minister was not by reason of his power to appoint councillors to the Legislative Council, able to obtain his will to the legislative ordinances of the Territory. Appointed members other than official members were free to exercise their own judgment. S. Deb. 20.

#### *Papua and New Guinea*

On 4 April, the Minister for Territories described, in answer to a question upon notice, the decisions made by the Government with respect to Trust Territory of New Guinea arising out of the proposals contained in the Report of the United Nations Visiting Mission of 1962. H.R. Deb. 463.

On 9 April, in answer to questions upon notice, the Minister for Territories listed, and stated the general effect of, measures approved by the Legislative Council for the Territory from and including the June 1962, sittings, the purpose of which was to remove racial discrimination. H.R. Deb. 542-543.

On 23 October, the Minister for Territories denied that a separate currency would be introduced for the Territory to coincide with the change-over to decimal currency in Australia. H.R. Deb. 2123.

### **Trade**

On 21 May, the Acting Minister for Trade commented upon a proposal that Australia participate in a South-East Asia free-trade bloc. S. Deb. 555.

### **Transport**

#### *Civil Aviation*

On 15 May, the Minister for Civil Aviation commented upon the statutory restrictions governing the ability of T.A.A. to operate helicopter charter services. S. Deb. 435.

On 26 September, the Minister for Civil Aviation said that a convention to be drafted in Tokyo relating to offences committed on board aircraft would not affect the Crimes (Aircraft) Bill then before Parliament. S. Deb. 847.

On 23 October, the Minister for Civil Aviation commented upon the *B.C.P.A.-Kapell* case, commenced in 1954, involving the question of the measure of damages in air accident cases, and its relation to the Warsaw Convention. S. Deb. 1333.

### *Railways*

On 23 May, the Minister for Shipping and Transport, in reply to questions upon notice, outlined the attitude of the Commonwealth in replying upon the statutory limit of £2,000 on damages recoverable in personal injury cases as set out in section 81 of the Commonwealth Railway Act 1917-1956. In the case in question an ex-gratia payment of £3,000 was made to supplement the amount of liability under the Act. Section 81 is under review. H.R. Deb. 1815.

### **Miscellaneous**

#### *Commonwealth Motor Vehicles (Liability) Act 1959*

On 17 April, the Minister for the Interior stated, in answer to questions upon notice, that three claims had been made under the above Act and that two of these had been settled by consent. H.R. Deb. 192.
